

Dear Interested Parents:

As you know, we at HLCA are offering our services on a limited basis to assist you in your homeschooling endeavors. This year we will be offering the following in the HLCA Homeschooling Program:

Elementary/Junior High students: Registration for the year will be \$175.00 per student. This fee will cover registration with ACSI which allows participation in all ACSI events (spelling bees, speech meets, etc.), all SAT testing and administration fees which we administer at the end of the year, and other miscellaneous student related costs.

An administration fee of \$30.00 per quarter (\$120.00 per year) per student gives that student entry into our student database as a covering for you as a parent. They are recognized as HLCA students, they receive a report card, a permanent file is maintained and sent on a regular schedule, and you have the privilege of talking with our staff to get teaching tips and help.

You will have the ability to purchase your curriculum at 'school prices.' This can result in a considerable savings for you. We require that you pay for the curriculum prior to our sending in the order. We require that you use our 'core curriculum' along with anything else you desire, but we will only order the 'core' for you. We would like you to come in to do the ordering so that we can talk face to face.

High school students: Individual classes are available for high school students meeting the criteria for entrance into a class. Homeschool students are not considered full-time students. Homeschool students must agree to the standards set by HLCA and interview with the administrator or principal prior to registration. Registration for the year will be \$175.00 per student. This fee will cover registration with ACSI which allows participation in all ACSI events (spelling bees, speech meets, etc.), all SAT or PSAT testing and administration fees which we administer at the end of the year, and other miscellaneous student related costs. Cost per class, per semester: \$325.00 (includes curriculum, lab fees if applicable). A semester is 18 weeks, 4 days a week, Monday-Thursday. Extra benefits include: small class size, college night, sports programs, class field trips, access to dyslexia screening/tutoring, transcripts. *See additional course information following this letter.

To get the program underway, you need to fill out the registration form and the Parental Support Letter. Please bring them with you when you come in to interview and/or

make your curriculum order. Please call the school office to make that appointment. When you come in, the registration and curriculum fees will be due. When these are paid you will be added to our school roster, your order placed, and your grade sheet forms for the first quarter will be given and explained. The remaining administration fee, if applicable, may be paid at any time during the school year. Unlike our regular students, your school year may take either 9, 10, 11 or 12 months. Our only restriction is that you begin the next year after you have finished the current year and that year must end by July 31. This means you could go to school from August 1 through July 31 in any combination that would fit.

Finally, we ask our homeschool families to pay close attention to the weekly school email. Watch for upcoming events (field trips, picture day, extracurriculars), days off, etc. If you have a question about your child(ren)'s ability to participate, please call the school office. We hope you will enjoy being a part of the HLCA Homeschool Program. Your students will benefit from their attachment to us not only academically, and as a covering agent, but also in their ability to participate in the extra-curricular events, field trips and ACSI sponsored competition. We feel that this is a quality, affordable program and hope you do also. God bless you in your educational decisions.
